Bathurst will celebrate over 200 years of its rich history, paying homage to the trades and traditions that have helped shape the region, at the award winning Bathurst Heritage Trades Trail at the historic Bathurst Showground.

Rediscover rare and lost trades and crafts with traditional indigenous tool-making, blacksmithing, saddlery, dry stone walling, whip cracking and making, lace making, carpentry and joinery, instrument makers including violins and ukeleles, local beeswax candles and honey, soap making, buttons, bodgers and fletchers, Cobb & Co coach rides, antique cycles, vehicles and tools on display, plants, spinners, weavers and coloured sheep among many unique talents to be demonstrated by local and guest artisans.

The Bathurst District Historical Society will have a display of photographs of heritage trades in Bathurst from the late 1800's to early 1900.

A free hop-on hop-off shuttle bus will be available to visit a number of Bathurst's finest heritage attractions over the weekend, with discounted entry available to all Heritage Trades Trail ticket holders.


